Minimum requirements for obtaining a subsurface wastewater treatment system may include obtaining a copy of the certificate of survey for your parcel of property from the Clerk & Recorder's office, excavating a 10 feet deep test pit in the area of the proposed system, performing a percolation test, taking a nitrate sample from an existing or nearby well, and/or providing other information to fulfill the minimum requirements outlined in the Central MT Health District Regulations for Subsurface Wastewater Treatment Systems.
